

Chain of Responsibility Policy

Openshore Pty Ltd is a provider of trenchless directional drilling services. In the course of providing this service, Openshore has the need to operate heavy vehicles.

When operating it's heavy vehicles, Openshore will:

- Ensure that loads are within maximum legal gross vehicle and axle load limits;
- Ensure that loads are within maximum legal height, length, width and overhang limits;
- Ensure that loads are secured within freight containers and within/on vehicles so that they do not make the vehicle unstable or unsafe and are secure and not likely to shift or fall out of/off the vehicle;
- Ensure that drivers are not adversely affected by fatigue and are within their maximum permitted driving hours;
- Ensure that journeys are capable of being completed and actually completed within legal speed limits;
- Ensure that vehicles comply with any applicable heavy vehicle standards and at all times during use are properly maintained and roadworthy.

To achieve the above, Openshore shall:

- Establish, maintain and certify a health and safety system based on AS/NZS ISO 45001:2018,
- Comply with the Work Health & Safety legislation of 2011;
- Comply with the Heavy Vehicle legislation of 2013;
- Establish and maintain a risks-based approach to its business operations;
- Comply with statutory requirements, codes, standards and guidelines;
- Communicate our commitment and make this policy available to interested parties;
- Ensure our employees and stakeholders use appropriate work practices through effective consultation and communication;
- Periodically review this policy and the overall performance of our Chain of Responsibility initiatives.
